# **About Good Friday**

Jesus, the Lamb of God, is led to the slaughter of His cross as the Sacrifice of Atonement for the sin of the world. "Despised and rejected by men, a man of sorrows and acquainted with grief" (Is. 53:3), He is the righteous Servant who justifies many by His innocent suffering and death. He bears our griefs and sorrows; He is wounded for our transgressions; He is crushed for our iniquities; He suffers our chastisement; "and with his wounds we are healed" (Is. 53:4–5). As the Son of God, He fulfills the Law for us in human flesh, and so fulfills the Scriptures (John 19:7, 24). In perfect faith and faithfulness, He shares all our weaknesses and temptations, "yet without sin" (Heb. 4:15). As our merciful High Priest, He brings us to the Father in peace, "makes intercession for the transgressors" (Is. 53:12) and joins our prayers to His own, so that we are heard "because of his reverence" (Heb. 5:7). From His cross, He gives us His Spirit (John 19:30), washes us with water from His side and covers us with His blood (John 19:34).

The Tre Ore service is a continuation of the Triduum (Latin for "the three days"), an ancient and holy service. The service began last night with Maundy Thursday, and continues today with the Tre Ore and the Tenebrae (Service of Darkening), and then concludes with the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday.

The name of Good Friday may have originally been "God's Friday," but is certainly also "good" because of the good gifts Christ won for us on this day.

Good Friday is not observed as a funeral for Christ. It is a day for repentance over sin and restrained joy and praise for the redemption Christ accomplished for us on the cross. A common custom for Good Friday is that the altar is either bare or vested in black, having been stripped on Maundy Thursday.

The words "Tre Ore" are Latin for three hours. While our service today is three hours, a custom in many churches in years past, the name of the service, Tre Ore, is actually in reference to the last three hours of crucifixion (out of six) when darkness covered the earth.

As this service is a continuation of the Triduum, there is no Invocation or Benediction.

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# First Word of Jesus from the Cross Noon-12:20

I confess my iniquity;






First Word

Luke 23:32-38

And Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." And they cast lots to divide his garments. And the people stood by, watching, but the rulers scoffed at him, saying, "He saved others; let him save himself, if he is the Christ of God, his Chosen One!" Hear my prayer, O Lord;










Second Word Luke 23:39–43

Hebrews 9:12a, c, 15a; Ps. 111:9a


[Christ] entered once for all into the holy places, by means of his own blood, thus securing an eternal redemption.

He does not deal with us according to our sins,


nor repay us according to our iniquities.

Help us, O God of our salvation, for the glory of your name;


deliver us, and atone for our sins, for your name's sake!


# Fifth Word of Jesus from the Cross 1:40-2:00






